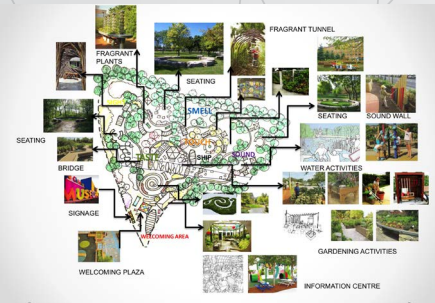

She holds a PhD degree from the University of Copenhagen. Her PhD research focused on the design of green outdoor environment in health care facilities.
